



KRKA NATIONAL PARK

HALF DAY EXCURSION – JUNE 11, 2015

The Krka National Park was proclaimed in 1985, as the seventh national park in Croatia, though certain sections of the Krka River were already protected as early as 1948. The national park is a vast and primarily unaltered area of exceptional natural value, including one or more preserved or insignificantly altered ecosystems. The purpose of the park is primarily to serve science, culture, education and recreation, while tourism activities have also been introduced for its visitors.

Krka National Park lies within Šibenik-Knin County, covers a total area of 109 km² of the loveliest sections of the Krka River, and the lower course of the Čikola River.



13:30 h Group meeting - MedILS Istitute,

14:45 h Departure to Krka NP, sightseeing:.

Skradinski buk is the longest and most visited waterfall on the Krka River, and one of the best known natural features in Croatia. These cascades are formed by travertine barriers, islands and lakes, making this one of the most unusual and loveliest landscapes in the park. The travertine cascades of the Krka River are very fragile and sensitive to natural changes and all human activities. Bathing is permitted at Skradinski buk. Visitors can also visit the old water mills, the ethnography collection, the souvenir shop or find refreshment in one of the hospitality facilities.

18:00 h Departure to Skradin which is simply magical in its each and every detail. Free time for individual sightseeing in Skradin,

19:00 h Dinner in the Skala Restaurant with nice view of the marina, traditional food, beverage included,

20:30 h Departure for return to Split; 21:30 h estimated arrival time.

Price includes bus transportation, entrance ticket to Krka NP, dinner, official tour guide during the excursion, organisation.
